

Emily Spearman won the Women's' Engineering Society Karen Birt Award in 2008

Congratulations to Emily Spearman who recently won the Women's' Engineering Society Karen Birt Award for the most outstanding newly chartered female engineer 2008.

The Karen Burt Memorial Award is an annual Award to encourage more women to aim for Chartered Engineer and corporate status. Karen Burt was a tireless campaigner for the recruitment and retention of women in science and engineering. From her own experience and her extensive research she was regarded as an expert in the management of career breaks and women 'returners' to engineering.

Karen graduated from Newnham College, Cambridge and obtained a PhD from Reading University. She joined British Aerospace Systems at Stevenage as project engineer for scientific satellites and progressed to Senior Systems Engineer before developing an interest in management in the Total Quality Environment, and subsequently becoming Business Acquisition Manager. Leaving BAe, she set up her own consultancy and was instrumental in establishing the Centre for Advanced Instrumentation Systems within University College, London. She had just accepted a position on the staff of UCL when her career was abruptly ended by a devastating stroke. Karen is remembered as a gifted communicator and her fight to recover speech and mobility following her stroke was an inspiration to all who knew her.

Officially launched on 3 November 1998 by The Women's Engineering Society, the Karen Burt Memorial Award is made annually to a woman engineer of high calibre who has newly attained full corporate membership and Chartered Engineer status through her relevant Institution.

The award not only recognizes the candidate's excellence and potential in the practice of engineering and highlights the importance of Chartered status, but also gives recognition to contributions made by the candidate to the promotion of the engineering profession.

“Here We Go – Women Living the Strike!”

“Here We Go – Women Living the Strike!” is a documentary specifically focussing on the role that the women played during the most significant industrial battle of the 20th century – the 1984-85 miner's strike. Much has been recorded, filmed and written about the men's involvement in the strike, but as is often the case, the role of the women has been overshadowed – and yet without their support the strike could not have lasted the length that it did.

Although there had been many strikes in the past, the 1984-85 strike was unique in that many women were moved by, not only the impact this was to have on their own lives, but their whole communities and their cultural existence. Women therefore were able to use this unique experience as catalyst for being involved, not only in the soup kitchens, but politically! This exclusive film acknowledges the critical role that many of these brave women undertook and the subsequent impact this was to have on the next 25 years of their lives, and in many cases, changing the course of their lives forever! There are many moving accounts reflecting back on the past 20 years and yet the emotions are still as fresh as when they were first displayed.

A percentage of the proceeds of the sales will be donated to a fund which has been set up by the Women's History in Mining (Fife) Ltd, and this will go towards producing an educational pack along with the DVD and will be made available to all schools and colleges throughout Britain.

I recently attended the Marketing Institute of Ireland AGM. This was the second year in a row that I've attended this event and, on both occasions, only 3 women turned up. How can more women progress within marketing and business in general, if they are not out there meeting the people who run their profession and set the tone of how it is developed and perceived within the wider business community?

I'm tired of these marketing women telling me that they don't have time to go to networking events or seminars as they have kids etc. but really once a month, or in the case of an AGM once a year, is not too much to ask. Ask for some help with looking after the kids once a month. Ask their father or hire a babysitter. In my opinion, women are not very good at asking for help. They expect people to be able to read their minds. If you don't ask, you don't get.

If you don't turn up nobody will know you exist. They won't know how great you are or what great skills and personality you can bring to their company or organisation if they've never heard of you or met you.

Lots of organisations are 'old boy networks' for the simple reason that no women show up.

This doesn't just apply to female marketers of course. The above was just something that struck me being female and having moved to Dublin a couple of years ago and having to start building a life and career in a new city from scratch. I suppose I've had to make more of an effort. The people who work for the MII know me now by name yet I've only been to maybe 6 events over two years. So you really don't have to go to events all that often for people to be able to recognise you, and it all helps in building relationships.

As the Chinese saying goes, 'A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step.'

Be bold. Just turn up.
